Multiple Births Canada's (MBC) mission is to improve the quality of life for multiple-birth individuals and their families in Canada. We fulfil our mission by providing support, education, research, and advocacy locally, nationally and internationally to those that have a personal or professional interest in multiple-birth issues.

In 2012 MBC became a Canadian Registered Charity, with the objective "to promote the health of twins, triplets and other multiple-birth individuals and their families by developing and providing educational resources and programs".

Benefits of an MBC Membership

All members of Multiple Births Canada (MBC) receive the following benefits:

- Regular E-News updates by email, including the latest news in the area of multiple births and Multiple Births Canada, information on new resources or publications and discounts offered to MBC members.
- Access to MBC's Facebook groups for private discussions on a variety of multiple birth topics.
- Access to national product and service discounts and other special offers.
- Access to zygosity information and low-cost zygosity testing.
- Advice and counsel on major health or parenting issues provided by the Advisory Board and other professionals as needed through national office.
- Discounted registration fee for the <u>Annual General</u> <u>Meeting and Conference</u>.
- Voting rights at the Annual General Meeting.
- Representation in the International Society for Twin Studies (ISTS) and in the International Council of Multiple Birth Organizations (ICOMBO).

Affiliate Organizations (Chapters) receive additional benefits, including:

- Access to training and networking through designated sessions at the Annual Conference or through Volunteer and/or Chapter Development Retreats.
- Access to the Organization Executive portion of the MBC website, with documents on running your local support organization for multiple-birth families.
- Membership in the MBC Chapter Support Network to connect with volunteers in other multiple-birth support Organizations and share ideas.
- Opportunities for networking through social media.

- Organization listing on the national website, including a link to your website if you have one.

Members, groups and organizations also benefit from having direct access to the Executive Director, MBC's Board of Directors, Support Network Chairs and many national volunteers. Many have devoted more than ten and even twenty-five plus years to MBC and its predecessor, POMBA Canada, and most have experience with a local Chapter as well as the national and international organizations.

Most got involved in the multiple-birth community first as a parent, and then as a source of support for other parents. Some questions may be referred to a professional Advisory Board (physicians, nurses and leaders in the not for profit / charitable sector), offering assistance through the national office.

Your membership supports the work of MBC

Your membership fees enable Multiple Births Canada's dedicated staff and volunteers to serve the multiple-birth community across Canada, to network with service providers and agencies, and educate the public. MBC's key projects and activities include:

Supporting Families and Professionals:

- Working to improve the support offered to individuals, parents and families through a variety of Support Networks (i.e. Preterm Birth, Breastfeeding, Loss, Higher Order Multiples, Francophone, LGBTQ+, Fathers, Lone Parents Special Needs and Adult Multiples), and other services available to multiple-birth individuals and their families across the country.
- Producing a comprehensive library of educational publications (some available in French) including over 70 Fact Sheets.
- Producing our electronic magazine Multiple Moments and our E-News newsletter.
- Promoting stronger relations between parents of multiples and professionals who are interested in multiple births issues (e.g. doctors, nurses, educators, researchers). This work helps to ensure that professionals are aware of the unique needs and concerns of multiple-birth individuals and their families.
- Sharing multiple birth information and research findinas with members and Organizational Members (Chapters) through publications, E-News, the website, social networking and at Multiple Birth Canada's Annual General Meeting and Conference.
- Advising professionals who support multiple-birth physicians, nurses, prenatal instructors, educators, bereavement counselors) to ensure the best and most up-to-date care is provided to all multiple-birth individuals and families.

Partnerships and Networking:

Representing the Canadian multiple-birth at national and international conferences, and in research, health promotion, through partnerships and other related initiatives. These activities help raise awareness of multiple

- birth issues, and help to ensure that researchers, government officials and other professionals consider the needs and concerns of multiple-birth individuals and families.
- Networking with other national health and childbirth organizations to promote multiple birth issues within Canada. These organizations seek out Multiple Births Canada to represent the Canadian multiplebirth community and provide input on key policies, programs, and proposals that affect multiple-birth individuals and families.
- Networking with international organizations to promote multiple birth issues on the international stage. This work resulted in the often-cited Declaration of Rights and Statement of Needs of Twins and Higher Order Multiples.

Media Relations and Public Education:

- Advising local and national media on multiple birth issues to ensure the interests and concerns of multiple-birth individuals and families accurately conveyed.
- Working with government agencies to enhance services, supports, and opportunities for multiplebirth individuals and their families.
- Advancing the concerns and needs of multiplebirth individuals and their families to all levels of government, to advocate for the enhancement of services, supports, policies and programs, and to ensure equitable access to opportunities.
- Celebrating and promoting National Multiple Births Awareness Day each year with a focus on the specific needs and concerns of multiple-birth individuals and their families.
